Inclusive targeting of households facing multiple, intersecting vulnerabilities (gender, disability, ethnicity, climate risk)



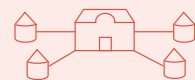
Co-creating Family Development Plans led by women – building economic and adaptive visions

Scaling up through federations that take on coordination and advocacy roles



Strengthening risk preparedness through community-based planning and early warning systems



Linking grassroots voices to power structures via rights-based advocacy and dialogue with authorities

What changes for people and communities?



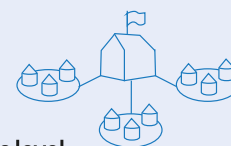
For households

- Women control resources and make livelihood decisions
- Household income and food security increase
- Families are better prepared for climate shocks



Within communities

- Women emerge as leaders and role models
- Groups pool savings, solve problems, and support each other
- Community norms begin to shift towards inclusion and equality



At systemic level

- Federations engage with public institutions
- Exclusion from services and rights is challenged
- Preparedness and accountability structures are locally owned
