CPRD aims to promote people-centred sustainable development through innovation, application and promotion of appropriate scientific, technical and local knowledge through research, model development, demonstration and implementation.

Positions and work

Md Shamsuddoha was involved in the preparation of a country position paper for Bangladesh on disaster risk reduction. He contributed significantly to the identification and prioritisation of sub-sectors that will be adversely affected by the impacts of climate change and assessed the technology needs to make these sectors/sub-sectors resilient. These assessments were compiled for the Technology Needs Assessment (TNA) and Technology Action Plan (TAP) for climate change adaptation and mitigation in Bangladesh and submitted to the Executive Committee on Technology of the UNFCCC for implementation. He conducted a number of research projects on the political economy of climate resilient planning and global climate finance. He has written and co-authored numerous articles on key issues in climate change policy and diplomacy.
